VULNERABILITY

•Comes from the Latin word "to wound"

•To be vulnerable is to be open to being wounded

•Risking failure

•Speaking truthfully

•Staying in (rather than remaining on the sidelines)

•Allowing for discomfort

SHAME

Shame is what keeps us from being vulnerable. It is the intensely painful feeling or experience of believing that you are flawed and therefore unworthy of love and belonging. It is universal.

- We all have the gremlins
- Shame is: "I have failed" vs. "I am a failure."
- What price do we pay, emotionally and spiritually, when we disengage and do not enter the arena?
- Shame undermines every path to joy, freedom and peace. It keeps us from daring greatly.
- The more we talk about shame the less power it has over our lives.
- Cultivating a shame resilient culture in our congregations.

Courage is the answer to shame Courage = Daring greatly Courage = Being all in
