The Fairfax County Community Chaplain Corps works as part of an emergency or disaster team to provide chaplain care to community members impacted by the effects of a disaster or emergency. Members of the Chaplain Corps may be deployed to assistance centers, homes or locations in Fairfax County to provide chaplain services to affected residents, family and friends.

Requirements include:

- Fairfax County residency
- Being ordained, invested or certified by a legitimate certifying body
- Successfully completing criminal background, child protective services, and driving record checks
- Participating in online and in person trainings

Community Chaplains are expected to:

- Serve as an on-call Community Chaplain 4 weeks annually
- Respond to major emergencies or disasters through the year beyond their on-call shifts
- Provide a sense of spiritual safety and security as well as a sense of healing and hope
- Complete a deployment log and an "After Action" report
