#### Purpose of the grant:

To encourage NCP congregations to become members of AIM, VOICE, or WIN—faith based, grassroots organizations committed to training and developing neighborhood leaders to address community issues such as public safety, housing, jobs and services for neighbors in need.

Grant criteria:

- The congregation must be a new member of Action In Montgomery (AIM), Virginians Organized for Interfaith Community Engagement (VOICE), or Washington Interfaith Network (WIN-DC). (For more information see links to web sites below)
- NCP will match a congregation's contribution up to \$500 per congregation toward first year dues or expenses for training leaders from the congregation in faith-based community organizing.
- After the first year of membership, the congregation's core team will provide a brief written report to the presbytery's Peace & Justice Advocacy Team describing what was learned about local community issues and how the congregation's ministry and outreach may have been strengthened and transformed as a result of training and membership in the regional organization.

### **Required attachments:**

A signed agreement with AIM, WIN or VOICE indicating the congregation's commitment to the organization's goals, training and public events.
