Action

"We are in need of a massive redirect. A counternarrative, where the people of God not only change the subject but reframe the discussion...

When the game needs changing, it's up to you and me...

And I started the time reminding you about the work of the people - liturgy is the work of the people. And so we dishonor the liturgy, we dishonor the basics of our reformed heritage when we are content to be passive. So now is not the time to be passive."
