The COM Coordinating Commission of National Capital Presbytery voted to strongly encourage sessions and congregations of our presbytery to allow pastors, if they desire to do so, to carry over unused continuing education time and allowances from 2020 into 2021. We offer this advice in light of how the pandemic resulted in the cancelling of continuing education events, discouraged travel, and made it difficult to get away for those who had family members (children or older adults) to care for, and increased pastoral responsibilities that made taking time off challenging. The COM stands ready to assist sessions and congregations in making the use of continuing education more accessible to pastors as we all deal with the challenges presented by COVID-19.

NCP churches looking to transition from Zoom/Facebook live/etc. into live streaming services from their sanctuaries we want to help take some of the guess work out of where to start. The proposal, "Hybrid Worship Proposal" posted on the TM page, is from Zeke Dowty. He has produced ALL NCP videos for more than 7 years (mission highlights, INSIDE with the GP, tribute videos), all found on NCP's <u>YouTube Channel</u> and his wife, the Rev. Dana Olson, is a minister member of our Presbytery. Zeke has worked with several churches in our Presbytery, all very happy with his work. What Zeke is offering is designed to be easy to operate and can be done by any leader/volunteer in your congregation. This isn't intended to be the ONLY option for live streaming, but it is one we in the NCP office are fully confident in supporting. <u>Tech Support Grant Request</u>

We are also offering our congregations information on **web support** through NCP's provider, **Tomahawk**. Posted on the TM page is a proposal for services offering the ability to add streaming services for live church sermons, events, and other social events.

# The Miseducation of the Nation

As McCormick's Initiative for Incarnational Ethics prepares for its Spring Lecture, Dr. Reggie Williams, associate professor of Christian Ethics and director of the Initiative, opens up the discussion that will explore how education has been used to form a society that embraces white supremacy as the norm.

"What was 'stolen' from the people who stormed the Capitol and ransacked the place on January 6," questioned Dr. Reggie Williams, associate professor Christian Ethics and director of McCormick's Initiative for Incarnational Ethics. "It wasn't money nor an election; it was a belief that they were losing their coveted grip on the dominating concept of white supremacy."

This is a recurring pattern, noted Dr. Williams, and one that will be a focus of

the Spring Lecture that will be given by Dr. Willie Jennings, associate professor of Systematic Theology and Africana Studies at Yale Divinity School. "One of things that Dr. Jennings points out for us is a sensitivity to theological education that shapes us to an understanding of life that is governed by white supremacy as normal," said Dr. Williams. "It's a violent practice of inclusion that incorporates black people and other racial groups in ways that demonstrate that whites are superior. Think slavery, Jim Crow, housing discrimination,

voter suppression and other political measures to keep 'others in their place' and away from experiencing full citizenship. Much of the education in this nation cunningly facilitates those political practices by teaching us all how to know our place in a racist society."

Moving into its second year, the Initiative for Incarnational Ethics is seeing greater interaction among scholars, pastors, and the community. Its audience

was expanded last year, recording more than 600 viewers from across the nation for its Gathering of Pastors that was held online due to the pandemic.

"One of the aims on our lecture series is to broaden the understanding of the Christian life to one that centers on justice as the way of Jesus," stated Dr. Williams. "We want to look at how the ideology of white supremacy shows up in theological education in order to help dismantle, within our own psyche and that of others, the problems it poses for the well-being of us all."
