Dear Clerks of Session,

The Session Records Committee and I have designed a two -part plan for reviewing minutes/registers/rolls. Because of Covid restrictions, many of the 2019 reviews were postponed in the spring of 2020. The 2020 in person reviews were also postponed. As more people are vaccinated, we are hopeful that in the fall of 2021 we will be able to schedule in person reviews.

Meanwhile, we are asking you to do a self-review of 2019 and 2020 records. The checklist provides space for you to note special circumstances that may have occurred due to the pandemic and social distancing. <u>Here is the link</u> to the check list for 2019 and 2020:

What's that you ask? Any updates on: Dismantling Racism Trainings; Global Mission Network Survey; Allyship Trainings; Light to the Nations Fellowships; Learning Labs; New Worshipping Communities of NCP; Innovation Cohorts, DC-Young Adult Volunteers; and me? Well, I am glad you asked. Here is a brief update with links, attachments, or a person to contact if you have more curiosity about the impact and reach happening through all of this!

The Dismantling Racism Team of NCP continues to provide ongoing trainings through this year. <u>Registration</u> is now open for the Fall: Cohort #2 (clergy and other ministry professionals of NCP) and Allyship Training (any members and friends of NCP congregations and communities). Information/registration link included in this TM.

With support from the *Mission Coordinating Committee*, there are several updates. Thank you for participating in the <u>Global Mission Network</u> Survey. Almost half of our congregations participated. The responses will be shared next month. Again, thank you! DC-YAVs are interviewing candidates to join the '21-'22 program year here in DC. The board intends to work with four volunteers. So far, placement sites are with NCP office and PCUSA Office of Public Witness here in DC. We are looking for other working placement sites.

With support from the *Church Development Committee/Commission* there are new things happening all over! Learning Labs and Innovation Cohorts (by invitation only) have begun with Convergence! Thank you to the Spiritual Formation Team, CDC, and COM for your leadership and enthusiasm. We hear that NCP folks want more! We intend to get back with you soon. Light to the Nations, our fellowship communities, are working closely with Rev. Yena Hwang and Elder Joyce Rarumangkay in discerning each of their next growth opportunities. Pray along with them and consider becoming a missional partner with them and their growth! New Things Team continues to navigate the adaptive work of supporting New Worshipping opportunities and leaders in NCP. Brazilian Bible Church, Riverdale Fellowship, and Clarksburg Ministry all have been accepted into the 1001NWC grant program this year. Join the New Things Team for an Open Space update at the May Presbytery meeting.

CALLING ALL NCP YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS

Peace and Justice Team of, the Mission Coordinating Committee (MCC) NCP, led by Trey Davis and Pat Petty Morse is looking to organize a core focus group of youth/young adults, that will identify or create peace and justice initiatives in the presbytery.

The year 2020 has been a pivotal moment in the Presbytery, in our communities, and in our country. During an ongoing pandemic and a tumultuous presidential election, there were demonstrations and protests nationwide in response to many issues including police brutality, institutional racism, and white supremacy. We saw many young people of all races take to the streets to make their voices heard. And we heard them! In the years leading up to 2020, the youth, along with others, were demonstrating and protesting mass shootings and gun violence, mass incarceration, violence against women and members of the LBGTQ community, abuses against immigrant communities, climate change, and environmental justice including native reservations.

The questions: What is the church going to do about it? What stance is the church taking on these issues? What is NCP going to do to support our young people who have taken the lead in addressing many of these issues?

The Peace and Justice Team of NCP propose creating a core group of youth and young adults to lead us in an effort by way of a "Peace and Justice Youth/Young Adult Summit." This one-day summit would provide a forum/panel discussion to shape how NCP will address these issues.

We are asking that each one of our congregations identify a youth/young adult with passion for justice and advocacy, who may be interested in helping to organize the summit and to develop a Presbytery wide ministry.

NATIONAL CAPITAL PRESBYTERY, PC(USA) VOTED TO DIVEST FROM FOSSIL FUELS ON MARCH 23, 2021



YCAP is a program of the Earth Care Network of National Capital Presbytery, involving an intergenerational partnership of youth and adults in the presbytery seeking to fulfill the 2006 PC(USA) 'carbon neutral lives' resolution by advocating for net-zero greenhouse gas emissions in the church while measuring current emissions and monitoring reductions over time.

This Earth Day, YCAP released *our article on National Capital Presbytery's 3/23/21 decision to divest from fossil fuels* and we invite you to take another step towards a net-zero denomination by completing *our building portfolio survey*, answering questions about your congregation's building/s and associated energy usage.
