### NCP Congregational Global Mission Survey Results

May 15, 2021

#### **Background and Process**

- Objective of Global Mission Network is
  - "To provide a framework to advance the Presbytery's emphasis of serving as a catalyst for mission by connecting congregations with common local, national, and international mission interests."
- In December 2020, Network reimplemented global missions page on NCP website to provide added outreach to NCP Congregations
- Network also decided to conduct a survey of NCP congregations to help to understand
  - Ongoing global mission activities across the Presbytery and
  - How the network can support congregational global mission efforts
- Survey
  - Finalized in February 2021
  - Distributed by Thursday Mail and Presbytery email notifications to Congregations
  - Closed on 15 April



## What is your congregation's experience with NCP global mission partnership matching grants to congregations?



# Does your congregation currently have any active global mission partnerships?


No, our congregation does not have any global mission partnerships and there is no interest at this time	21% 8

#### Outreach

- Visit NCP churches and present classes on global mission experiences and possibilities. Provide dates and times of network and NCP Global Missions Network meetings, maybe in Thursday Mail.
- Perhaps some kind of quarterly email update to congregations with info that is easy to use—i.e., mission trips. fundraising events, speaker bureaus
- Get the word out!
- Continue to reach out across the Presbytery to include more churches

# What other things would your congregation like to let the Global Missions Network know in order to increase their support to NCP congregations? (2 of 3)

#### Grants and Financials

- Our congregation gives annually to the PC(USA) Unified Mission Giving budget, and we're
  curious what percentage of our contribution goes directly to the NCP Global Mission Network?
  In addition, we'd love to better understand the total operating budget of the NCP Global
  Mission Network and breakout of said budget amongst the different programs / partnerships.
- Issue an **annual report** showing the actual \$ amounts and % of funds that go directly to mission organizations and the \$ amount and % that go to overhead expenses such as staff, travel, etc.
- Either revise criteria for NCP global mission partnership **grants** so that travel by members of the congregation isn't so necessary or provide examples if that's not the case.

# What other things would your congregation like to let the Global Missions Network know in order to increase their support to NCP congregations? (3 of 3)

#### Information on

- Are there things that would make it easier when we go on international mission trips? What about an established relationship with a travel insurance company that would provide emergency medical care/evacuation?
- Share or point us to resources that help congregations form and/or work towards best practices in the area of global mission partnerships.
- Help congregations understand the larger shifts and changes in global mission that impact all of our various projects (more helpful than "show and tell" sessions). What does transformation look like in this space? What old ways may need to be left behind, and what needs to be embraced?
- Keep us informed of **projects** we may or should be participating in. It would be great to have resource/think tank for something like loading a tractor/trailer of supplies to Liberia, for example. We are interested in other work in Haiti.
- Listing of best information sources for small countries that rarely get news coverage, or information as to how to research same.

#### In sum

- NCP congregations are active in global mission
  - Most have active global mission partnerships (71%)
  - Most financially support global mission organizations (92%), particularly Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, although less than half support PCUSA mission coworkers (39%)
  - Most congregations with active mission partnerships are willing to contribute to an NCP global mission directory
- Opportunities for added GMN outreach
  - Many congregations are unaware of global mission grants (36%)
  - Most congregations which were unaware of the Network said they would be interested to know more
- Recommendations for action
  - Post presentation on GMN NCP web page
  - Continue current efforts
  - Follow-up on creating global mission directory
  - Clarify grants PCUSA not a requirement, nor is travel (provide example), require participation in directory
  - Add outreach to increase participating congregations quarterly newsletter?
  - Provide insights on financials and grants link on webpage showing prior year budget and expenditure
  - Share more information and events to support congregations in
    - Forming mission partnerships
    - Organizing mission trips
    - Engage on common topics
    - Address larger changes affecting global mission
