DML Training:

DML is currently virtual and instead of being 4 days in one location, it is one day, four weeks in a row.

Accelerator training can happen 2 ways:

1st option is through NWC Online Accelerator Training with the above registration dates and from there the cohort will choose when to have their meetings. It is 6 weeks with a 1 hour video and 90 minutes with a 10 person cohort.

2nd option is In-person NWC Accelerator Training (right now that option is also virtual). This training would happen 2 times a year in alternating cities. While it is virtual it is 5, 3-hour meetings. The first cohort meets, May 5, 12, 19, 26, and June 2 (12:00 pm EST- 3 pm EST) and 2nd cohort meets Oct 27, Nov 3, Nov 10, and Nov 17 (12:00pm EST – 3 pm EST)
