Let Freedom Ring: Journeys through the Civil Rights Movement and the Roots of American Music Alabama Pilgrimage 2022

Join a "Civil Rights Pilgrimage" to Birmingham and Montgomery Alabama from March 21-27, 2022. Led by Reverends Maggie and Larry Hayward, pastors at Northwood in Silver Spring and Westminster in Alexandria, the trip is organized by Classical Movements, a Washington, DC agency. This trip will expose participants to the political, cultural, and agricultural landscape of the South, fundamentally shaped by the institution of slavery and its after-effects, and the way some of the world's most vibrant and distinctive musical styles impacted the Movement. Greetings Partners in Ministry,



I want to share a few updates from different parts of the life of our presbytery...

Retreat

In the winters that preceded this pandemic we offered a retreat away at the beach in Ocean City for church leaders around the presbytery. For good reason, we put it on hold last year. Having a year away has given us some time and space to rethink a whole new shape this retreat will take on in the years to come. We not only want to offer time for relaxation and renewal but for our leaders to walk away with practical pieces that are going to strengthen their ministries. In the pages of this post, you will see a "save the date". So, mark your calendars and keep your eyes peeled for more information to come.

Worship and Theology

Traditionally, our Worship and Theology team has been responsible for planning the worship services that are part of our presbytery meetings. Starting in 2022 the team will be expanding the work they do in service to all of you. For many church leaders who are involved in the week-to-week planning of worship it is often hard to find time to participate in worship. Our team wants to help change that. The hope is to offer worship services throughout the year, not tied to a Tuesday night presbytery meeting, to allow leaders time to participate in worship and to experience worship in new ways.

COLA

Each year, usually late in the summer, Committee on Ministry (COM) puts together all the requirements and recommendations about pastor compensation. As part of that process, they put forward a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) as a guideline to help churches plan for their upcoming budgets. Since late summer, the Consumer Price Index, which is where we gather our data, has had a significant increase. Our formula will not see this increase until next year. This means there might be a very steep figure moving forward for 2023. To better prepare for that potential increase, and to have a more real time figure for 2022, we are encouraging churches to go above and beyond the 1.5% increase. COM will also be reexamining how we calculate this figure going forward and will keep you informed along the way.

Healthy Boundaries

Like all things during this pandemic, finding a way to fully translate something we did in person to a completely digital experience has been a constant challenge. The Sexual Misconduct Response Coordinating Team has been trying to find a way to fulfill our requirement for a "Healthy Boundaries" training. The team has chosen to use a completely digital package that can be done on demand, which means a time and place that is most agreeable to the user's schedule. We offer an opportunity to complete the training during the remainder of this year as well as using the same platform for 2022. Please be on the lookout for registration information.

In the past few weeks, some of us have been gathering with one another NOT in committee meetings. We have been gathering through webinars and conferences that are connecting us to one another in creative ways. I need this energy outside of myself! Fresh ideas stimulated those of us from NCP to connect with one another for follow-up discussion and ACTION. What a blessing that part of my work with our leadership and congregations is to connect our shared experiences so that we can be a blessing with the whole of our Presbytery!

Each of these gatherings have been virtual. I am reminded in each of these gatherings that profound Impact and Reach still occurs. We each did not know that the other was going to attend. It was heartening to see renewed connections outside of a committee meeting. We took the time to check in, hold one another in prayer, and follow up with some awesome crazy possible actions that will not be done alone! Bill shares: "I grew up on the desert, surrounded by stars, away from the city lights." It was there, in high school, with the aid of a six-inch telescope that Bill built himself, that theology began to prevail in his life. "Just trying to comprehend the vastness of the universe, for me, was a spiritual exploration of God's creation."

Bill Brown is the William Marcellus McPheeters Professor of Old Testament Columbia Theological Seminary in Atlanta. He has abiding interests in the use of scripture in the life of the church and the world, particularly related to issues of ecology and justice: including creation theology, faith and science, the Psalms, and wisdom literature. He is a founder of the Earth Covenant Ministry, a grass-roots organization of Presbyterian churches in Georgia, and has offered seminars and workshops at Montreat, Ghost Ranch, and scores of churches. He coordinated the Science and Seminaries project at Columbia Theological Seminary, sponsored by the American Association for the Advancement of Science's program in the Dialogue on Science, Ethics and Religion.

Author of over a dozen books, Brown's recent publications include The Seven Pillars of Creation: Bible, Science, and the Ecology of Wonder (Oxford University), Wisdom's Wonder (Wm. B. Eerdmans), and Sacred Sense: Discovering the Wonder of God's Word and World (Wm. B. Eerdmans), and Editor of The Oxford Handbook of the Psalms (Oxford University Press). He was named as a Henry Luce III Fellow in theology for 2007-2008.
