

Description:	PEB provides quality education rooted in Christian values to all regardless of gender, religion, or the ability to pay. The 6000 students who attend the 25 schools are generally poor, come from rural areas, and may be representative of cultural or religious minorities. PEB also sponsors programs to enhance women's empowerment and adult literacy.
Opportunities:	Pre-Covid, PEB hosted tours to Pakistan twice yearly, one for educators interested in sharing instructional techniques with PEB teachers and the other highlighting school visits and interaction with students and staff. PEB's director, Mrs. Veda Gill visits church groups during her frequent visits to the U.S., and Friends of PEB, located in Thorndale PA, is a ready source of information.

Its Rector is Dr. Jonathan Addleton, born in Pakistan, former US Ambassador to Mongolia, and five-time Mission Director with USAID.

Description:	In 2015, the Chinunkha Congregation Partnership defined a developmental agenda for this remote community. The first project was an income generating activity that would enable the processing of locally grown maize. On May 13, 2021, the opening ceremony of the maize mills brough to fruition this first of many projects. Future partnership projects may include clean and safe drinking water, a nursery school and a Pig Project. All is done in partnership with the Synod of Livingstonia CCAP and the National Capital Presbytery of PCUSA.

Ahli Arab Hospital, Gaza City, Gaza

Congregation:	Bradley Hills Presbyterian Church
Description:	The only Christian hospital in the densely populated Gaza Strip, Ahli Arab Hospital provides compassionate care to all who walk through its doors. Gaza's borders are closed, but exceptions are made for the transport of medicines, medical supplies, fuel and water. The hospital needs help to continue its mission of caring for the sick and the injured and treating thousands of post-conflict trauma cases, many of them children who have lost family members.

Buyobo Community Development Association, Uganda

Congregation: Bradley Hills Presbyterian Church

Description: Local Village Health Teams volunteers, participating in a grassroots initiative provide health prevention services, trainings in basic self and family health care for rural residents, urgent first aid assistance, and emergency referrals to distant town hospitals. In 2003, Bradley Hills members traveled to Eastern Uganda responding to urgent needs for medical services delivery in rural Buyobo. A program called "Village Health Teams" was on the books in the Ministry of Health, but there were no working examples of how such programs were to operate. Through a carefully coordinated collaboration in which Bradley Hills members originally from Buyobo were key, Bradley Hills designed a partnership with a community development association to build a thriving volunteer service corps in a place where there was previously no culture of volunteerism. Now, through regular training sessions, Village Health Teams workers are highly respected, motivated and equipped to reach out to the rural community on foot and motorbike, rain or shine, to be the first line of treatment, information, assistance and inspiration.

Opportunities: Provide moral, consultative, and monetary backing for a robust community initiative in a politically sidelined region, offering prayer, correspondence, training visits and financial contributions. The latter cover the costs of equipment for building demonstration latrines, clean water filters, and boots and jackets for the volunteers, as well as the costs of bi-annual trainings in all-day lecture and demonstration sessions: travel for trainer and participants to rural training sites, food purchases and meals preparation for all volunteers attending the popular data-rich sessions, and printing costs for manuals.

- **Description:** The Sazu preschool, the first in this rural village of Malawi, is small BPC partnership program, funded by Christmas Alternative Gifts. To foster ownership, parents provide labor, especially during construction. Fortified flour for porridge is purchased with donated funds. The school which uses the renovations substantial praver house required and improvements. BPC with an NCP/GMN grant helped in this reconstruction and rehabilitation. With the outbreak of Covid 19 pandemic, construction is underway for a kitchen, toilets and other health related facilities, thanks to BPC and another matching GMN grant.

Embangweni Mission Hospital – Malawi The Antiretroviral Treatment Program

Location:

Malawi

Congregations: Burke Presbyterian Church)

Description: The Antiretroviral treatment program at the Embangweni Mission Hospital was founded by PCUSA Mission coworkers, Bill and Beth Rule, then from Leesburg PC and Beth, who had worked with an HIV program in Fairfax, quickly noticed signs of the disease among some hospital staff. At that time, they were unwilling to admit because of the associated stigma. Initially designed for the staff in 2002/3, the program has expanded to treat patients in the whole catchment area, served by outlying clinics. Dr. Martha Sommers who took over when Beth and Bill returned to the US, counselled BPC members that she needed to treat the patient holistically. Hence, apart from providing the HIV medications, the program now offers food and treatment for opportunistic diseases. It is now supervised and run by a Malawian doctor, Dr, Kondwani Zgambo.

Opportunities: A small sum, say \$25, helps to build this Trust Fund where the doctors at the hospital are now able treat the HIV patients holistically.

Description:	Since 2007, Grace has connected regularly with a congregation in Nablus and Rafidiya for friendship, visits between members, to support the missions of the Nablus churches and to witness to the stressful and severe living conditions of a people under occupation. Until the pandemic, Grace helped make it possible for youth from Nablus to participate every two years with youth from Grace in Tri-Cities Work Camp in Petersburg. Grace provides the Palestinian congregation with some financial support.
