This also means that the Unified Mission Budget of your presbytery is active as well as the Congregational Development committee/commission and Mission Coordinating Committee connect our congregations!

MCC updates: <u>The Earth Care Network</u> has granted a Power to Change grant to Fairlington Presbyterian Church. This goes along with an upcoming celebration of FPC's renovations and affordable housing collaboration later this summer! Church of the Pilgrims and several other NCP congregations are organizing to participate in the DC Pride parade in June. <u>A Local Mission Grant</u> is furthering their efforts of welcome, hospitality, and evangelism. The DC-YAV Event (flyer within this TM) is coming up at Fifteenth Street Presbyterian Church. With the Dismantling Team, the July registration is open for <u>Allyship training</u>.
