#### Announcements:

The Peace and Justice Team (PJT) of the Mission Coordinating Committee conducted a survey of congregations earlier in 2021 to solicit information on 1) current NCP congregational peace and social justice activities, 2) what social justice issues each congregation is passionate about, and 3) how the PJT can provide support to congregations in fostering those ministries. The results show congregations are actively engaged with a wide range of issues. Some of the more common themes include Black Lives Matter/Racial Justice, Immigration/Refugees, Mental Health, LGBTQ+, and Gun Violence/Mass Shootings. Respondents were in favor of developing a directory that would enable others in the Presbytery to connect with congregations doing work in their areas of interest and we hope to release on by this Fall.
