Greetings People,

The Mission Coordinating Committee (MCC) is putting together a "live" Google Doc for National Capital Presbytery pertaining to *emergency and long-term support for Immigration and Refugee ministry opportunities.*

At the MCC October meeting, the members discussed what can be an accessible way for our congregations to connect with on the ground needs and organizations pertaining specifically to refugee and immigration concerns. This discussion was put on the agenda as several congregations within NCP have been asking, "what can we do?" Each congregation has a particular request or opportunity that can relate specifically to refugees and specifically to immigration. MCC wants to be able to respond and support clear and direct coordination for all as we live into the Christ centered mandate, Love your Neighbor!

Committee member Elder Godlove Mbah from Berwyn Presbyterian Church shared that he is hopeful for this coordination. Not only because this can support churches responding to the ongoing bussing of migrants but also for churches like his where people from African countries, like Cameroon, are coming in asking how to find the services they need.

Several congregations are already connected to effective organizations that can meet these needs. Several congregations are seeking renewed ways to be effective and in relationship with these needs. One of the most important realities for us, members of National Capital Presbytery, is that in any way that we do connect, serve, support, and care for those on the margins and being isolated, we are doing this from the center of our faithfulness and discipleship to Jesus Christ.

So, when Capitol Hill Presbyterian, in their ministry with recently arriving bussed immigrants to DC, realize that before anything, how can they provide access to laundry services that are desperately needed...this can now include, as suggested by MCC member, Elder Marco Grimaldo, let us make sure we have some music in the space for the day so we can join in some hymn singing! WE are part of the Light of Jesus Christ! May our documents, our coordination, our welcome, our prayers, our worship continue to be the Light of Jesus Christ for all who find themselves in such a journey! 

A Note About All Saints' Sunday and Necrology Reports

On the first Sunday in November, many congregations lift in remembrance the names of members of the congregation that have died in the past year. Each year during worship at the November presbytery meeting, the names of Teaching and Ruling Ministers who have died in the past year are remembered.

The Book of Common Worship states:

"To rejoice with all the faithful of every generation expands our awareness of a great company of witnesses above and around us like a cloud (Hebrews 12:1). It lifts us out of a preoccupation with our own immediate situation and the

discouragements of the present. In the knowledge that others have persevered, we are encouraged to endure against all odds (Hebrews 12:1-2). Reminded that God was with the faithful of the past, we are reassured that God is with us today, moving us and all creation toward God's end in time. In this context, it is appropriate for a congregation on All Saints' Day to commemorate the lives of those who died during the previous year."

Before November 1, 2022, clerks of session are asked to use this link: https://forms.office.com/r/tpGhNCEisZ to submit the names of their congregation's *Ruling Elders* who have died in the past year. We ask that you complete the form whether or not you are reporting a death.




