

Dear Friends,

We Presbyterians believe that our reformed church is always in need of reform, according to the Word of God. With much prayer and discussion, we are constantly amending our *Book of Order* to make our structures and rules a more faithful expression of the church we believe God wants us to be. At the presbytery meeting on May 23, we will be voting on 33 proposed amendments to the *Book of Order* from the General Assembly.

NCP's Standing Rule #3 requires that each amendment be considered and voted upon separately. Because of the large number of proposed amendments this year, the Bills and Overtures Committee will recommend the suspension of this rule, and the use of the following process:

- 1. The Bills and Overtures Committee will recommend the approval of several simpler proposed amendments in an omnibus motion.
- 2. When the omnibus motion is presented, any voting member of the assembly will have the right to remove any of the proposed amendments from the omnibus motion for separate consideration.
- 3. If the presbytery adopts the omnibus motion, the Stated Clerk will report to the Office of the General Assembly that the presbytery has voted *in favor* of all the proposed amendments not removed from this motion. If the omnibus motion fails, then all the amendments will be considered separately.
- 4. The presbytery will proceed to consider the remaining proposed amendments in sequence.

The Bills and Overtures Committee has studied these proposals and is finalizing its recommendations, which will be released in advance of the stated meeting. In the meantime, I encourage you, if you have not already done so, to <u>read about the proposed amendments on the Office of the General Assembly's website</u>.

An Action Item Dialogue for discussion and questions regarding the proposed amendments will be held via Zoom on Monday, May 22, at 7:00 p.m. There will be time for your questions and insights, and a presentation on the proposed replacement to the Rules of Discipline section of the *Book of Order* (Amendment 22-GG). This event, as always, is optional—questions and comments are always in order during the formal consideration of business at the stated meeting.

The *Book of Order* reminds us that "[a]s the Church seeks reform and fresh direction, it looks to Jesus Christ who goes ahead of us and calls us to follow him" (F-1.0401). Your prayers and your faithful participation in the work of discernment will help us become the church that Christ needs us to be in this moment.

Others about love…even the Martians who come from above!



"At the River: Struggle and Grace in the Segregated South"

presented by Burke Presbyterian Church and the Dismantling Racism Team of NCP



At The River is a feature length film documentary about a certain time and place in the deep south. In the Civil Rights era of the 50's and 60's, most Presbyterian ministers stood on the banks of the cultural river of segregation and white supremacy. They opted not to stir the waters in their congregations and communities by speaking out. However, a few young southern Presbyterian ministers did brave those currents through their sermons, community organizing and participating in marches and protests. They faced dangerous, hate-filled consequences for these actions.

At The River chronicles their lives and their decisions, as well as director Carolyn Crowder's firsthand experience as a young white southern girl from Montgomery, Alabama. During those mean and turbulent times these ministers, through their love and example, had a huge impact on her life in helping her overcome her southern racist brainwashing.
