# Report of the Stated Clerk – National Capital Presbytery Stated Meeting – September 26, 2023

#### **Administrative Commissions**

- On June 5, 2023, the Administrative Commission for Garden Memorial Presbyterian Church acted in accordance with the authority conferred by the Presbytery on March 28, to **DISSOLVE** Garden Memorial Presbyterian Church as a congregation of the Presbyterian Church (USA). The Commission remains responsible for carrying out the following, in accordance with its charge:
  - 1. The continued exercise of original jurisdiction, in accordance with Book of Order G- 3.0303e.
  - 2. Pastoral care of the members.
  - 3. An appropriate celebration of the ministry and mission of the congregation.
  - 4. The orderly dismissal of members to other congregations of their choosing.
  - 5. Securing, holding, and using of the properties of the congregation, including the maintenance of property and liability insurance.
  - 6. The making of recommendations to the Presbytery about the sale or disposition of such property.
  - 7. Conveying all original church records (minutes, rolls, and registers) and historically important documents or artifacts to the Stated Clerk of the presbytery for preservation.
  - 8. Dissolving the legal corporation, once all property has been transferred or disposed of.

#### **National Capital Presbytery**

Committee on Representation Report for 2022 May 2023 Contextual Statistics

#### **Total Membership for 2022**

- 23,504 Active Members (A decrease of 1,240 Active Members from 2021)
- 103 congregations (A decrease of 1 from 2021)
- Of 20,505 Active Members who reported gender identity, 59.1% are female, 40.8% are male .1% are non-binary
- Of 149 Leadership Positions, 46.9% were fulfilled by females (49.1% female in 2019; 49.5% in 2020; 55.1% in 2021)

#### Age

- Of Active Members 25 years old and under, 0 serve in NCP Leadership positions (No change from 2021)
- Of Active Members 26-64 years old, 97 serve in NCP Leadership positions (A increase of 3 from 2021)
- Of Active Members 65+ years old, 52 serve in NCP Leadership positions (An decrease of 24 from 2021)

#### **Ethnicity**

Of the 23,504 Active Members during 2022 there were 149 Leadership positions (A decrease of 18 from 2021)

- 1. An estimated 5.8% of Active Members were Asian American; Ten Asian Americans were in Leadership positions (12 in 2021)
- 2. An estimated 14.2% of Active Members were African American/African; Twenty-four African Americans/African were in Leadership positions (28 in 2021)
- 3. An estimated 1.0% of Active Members were Hispanic or Latino; Two Hispanic/Latinos served in Leadership positions (2 in 2021)
- 4. There were an estimated one hundred and one Middle Eastern/North African members and an estimated twenty Native American members. These groups were not represented in NCP Leadership positions in 2021 or 2022
- 5. 24.2% of NCP Leadership Positions were held by Active Members other than Caucasian (19.9% in 2019; 21.3% in 2020; 25.1% in 2021)
- 6. Four of fourteen members of Leadership Council were other than Caucasian (4 of 14 in 2021)

## **Observations** - (1) There was a significant decrease in overall Leadership positions in 2022, from 167 to 149 or an 11% decrease. At the same time the leadership numbers in the 65+ age bracket decreased significantly from 76 to 53 or a 31.5% decrease.

(2) The number of members serving on multiple committees during 2022 is similar to 2020 and 2021
