Gifts or pledges that come in with the designation of benevolence/unified mission/shared giving go to support the mission budget, directly and exclusively. Without those dollars, NCP's reach and ability to support our congregations are immediately reduced. In the past couple of years, the mission budget has supported dozens of congregations with hybrid and online worship set ups, anti-racism training, congregational assessment tools, redevelopment opportunities, learning labs, countless continuing education opportunities for both laity and clergy, mission partnerships – the list goes on and on.

Giving to support the mission budget allows opportunity to be shared by our communities and distributed in a collective and equitable way. Your gift has the ability to impact not only all of the congregations in National Capital Presbytery but to leave a footprint on the folks that each of those congregations touch as well.
