

Do you know a high school senior who is discerning a call to ministry? We want to be sure that he/she/they know about The A. Purnell Bailey Pre-Ministerial Program at Randolph-Macon College.

This scholarship offers half-tuition during a student's freshman and sophomore years at R-MC and full-tuition during the junior and senior years. The Bailey Program includes weekly meetings for vocational discernment, creating a strong, supportive peer group. During a student's tenure in the program, there are many opportunities to visit with Theology School representatives, spend time with persons in a variety of professional ministry roles, and reflect on a personal sense of call. There are two internship opportunities, one for academic credit and one with a financial stipend. Randolph-Macon College in Ashland, Virginia enrolls over 1,500 undergraduate students who pursue their academic paths in fifty-five areas of study. The oldest United Methodist College in continuous operation, we are proud to be home to the Bailey Scholars program helping to prepare a new generation of leaders in the Church. 

#### **Summary of the 315<sup>th</sup> Stated Meeting of National Capital Presbytery**

The National Capital Presbytery held a stated meeting via Zoom teleconference on January 24. The Moderator, **Rev. Dr. Chris Deacon**, convened the meeting, and the co-chairs of the Commission on Ministry, **Rev. Carla Gorrell and Rev. Juli Wilson-Black**, led the assembly in its opening devotions.

During the meeting the presbytery:

- Recognized transitions and milestones in our community:
  - New member of NCP, the Rev. Koon Im Choi, serving as Stated Supply Pastor of Wheaton Community Presbyterian Church.
  - The upcoming ordination of Candidate Samuel Sarpong, called to serve as Designated Pastor of Ebenezer Presbyterian Church. The service will be held at Ebenezer on Saturday, February 10, at 1:00 p.m.
  - A celebration of NCP Director of Communications LaJuan Quander's 40 years of service to the presbytery, featuring a video with greetings from past colleagues.
- Approved a redevelopment plan for Clarendon Presbyterian Church that will provide affordable
  housing that is specifically welcoming to LGBTQIA+ seniors, as well as a gathering place for the
  congregation. Clarendon's pastor, the Rev. Alice Tewell, shared the congregation's excitement at
  discerning a faithful way to put its property in the service of mission in the community.

Presbytery's final approval comes at the end of a thorough exploration over more than three years between Clarendon Presbyterian Church, NCP's Administrative Commission on Congregational Property, and the Congregational Development Commission, which facilitated discernment through its administration and interpretation of the Church Assessment Tool (CAT).

If your church would like to explore creative and faithful projects like this one, please contact presbytery staff, so that we can help your congregation to step out in faith in this way!

- Established an Administrative Commission for Warner Memorial Presbyterian Church, whose session's members have become too few in number to govern the congregation. The Administrative Commission will visit with the outgoing and remaining members of the session and will exercise the authority of the presbytery in ways aimed at reconstituting the session.
- Approved an exception allowing the Rev. Rachel Vaagenes, currently serving as Stated Supply Pastor, to become the installed Pastor at Capitol Hill Presbyterian Church (Book of Order, G-2.0504c).
- Approved a waiver of the minimum time period of two years for two persons under care of the presbytery's Commission on Preparation for Ministry, Luke Bultena and A. R. (Flanny) Flannigan (Book of Order, G-2.0602, G-2.0610).

• Declined to forward a proposed amendment to the Book of Order to the General Assembly for consideration.

#### Greetings!

The first month of the year is interesting. We spend our time reflecting on and closing out last year while getting excited about the possibilities of the year we are starting. Don't believe me? We don't have the answers, but we invite you to flex your intelligence and energy by joining us in the conversation that impacts our denomination at all levels.

These topics are important, and they intersect with each other. I can't think of a single congregation in our Presbytery who doesn't have something to contribute to the dialogue. Greetings People,

This past week 12 members of NCP attended and worked at the Matthew25 Summit in Atlanta, GA. We were hosted at New Life Presbyterian Church <a href="https://www.newlifepresatl.com">https://www.newlifepresatl.com</a> This particular congregation is a current example of living out the Gospel through a lens of Matthew25.

The regular practices within the life of this congregation are Vibrant Worship that engages all generations, Lifelong Learning opportunities (in study and service), and constantly paying attention to the needs of the surrounding community and being flexible with connecting to those needs. I am highlighting this particular congregation because our denomination took a risk in having the Matthew25 Summit with a congregation! Rev. Dr. Diana Moffett (President and Executive Director of Presbyterian Mission Agency) stated in her welcome, "in-person attendance was so that, we as a connectional church could invest in ourselves". By investing in ourselves, we were able to honor how a congregation of people SHARE their building CONSTANTLY. Our attendance required the children's school at New Life to move to another church for the week. This happened because of their partnerships throughout the community. New Life and PCUSA took a risk in making this moment work TOGETHER.

The content was fulfilling. Worship was energizing. Seeing the collection of Presbyterians from all over the country was shocking in a good way. This was a SOLD OUT ticketed Presbyterian Conference! You will hear more about what the 12 have gained from this experience. For now, here is my question: What can we do together to INVEST in ourselves so that we are able to be an IMPACT of Jesus Christ with others?

I suggest THREE simple acts. First, please be sure your Clerk of Session and your Pastors have filled out the *Dismantling Racism Survey* (contact Dir. Of Communication LaJuan Quander if you have not seen this email). Your responses will impact how our presbytery organizes the resources for your congregations as we live in Matthew25. Second, in February the *HOLYCOW! Landscape* link will be sent to all current Minister Members of NCP and Registered Commissioners of our Presbytery Meetings. NCP participated in this survey 10 years ago. It supported how we organized priorities as a Presbytery. It is time to check in and update your input. Third, Clergy and church professionals attend our *Con-Ed Event* this March. We will Flex our ordination vows with Imagination, Energy, Love, and Intelligence facing how our properties and congregations are relevant today!

Congregational Vitality (Worship and Discipleship), Eradicating Poverty (Impact and Service), Dismantling Systematic Racism (Partnerships and Relationships) are the three legs lifted up in Matthew25. I am grateful to be with congregations who stand and sit well on this stool of ministry.




