Scotland and Lutherland

Glasgow – Oban – Iona – Edinburgh – Durham – Lindisfarne – Newcastle – Eisenach – Erfurt – Eisleben – Leipzig – Wittenberg – Berlin

Day 1: Monday, May 26, 2025: Leave the US

We leave the US for our overnight flight to Edinburgh, Scotland.

Day 2: Tuesday, May 27, 2025: Glasgow

Arrive in Edinburgh in the morning where we meet our bus and tour director. After everything is settled, we leave for Glasgow and start with a guided tour of the modern city with historic monuments and memories. In the afternoon we check in at our hotel. In the evening gather for a welcome dinner. D

Day 3: Wednesday, May 28, 2025: Oban

In the morning we board our bus and head north through the Western Highlands to Oban. The scenery is spell-binding. What we will be doing is following the flow of Celtic monks from Ireland to the British mainland. It was led by St. Columba who sailed to Iona in 563. We will visit his island tomorrow, but tonight it is into our hotel where we will attend a *ceilidh*. Have you got your dancing slippers? BD



Day 4: Thursday, May 29, 2025: Iona Iona is one of the two "holy islands" we will visit on this tour. We will catch the spirit of St. Columba's monastery, the heart of early Scottish Christianity, a renowned centre of learning and art which enjoyed a vast international reputation. From here Christianity was carried across Scotland and back into northern England. We return to Oban for the night. BD

Day 5: Friday, May 30, 2025: Edinburgh

We leave the Western Highlands and continue to Edinburgh, the capitol of Scotland. We will visit the Edinburgh Castle and the Royal Mile. The afternoon offers some free time to explore the Scottish capital on your own. Free evening, no group dinner tonight. B

Day 6: Saturday, May 31, 2025: Melrose ad Durham

Today it is onto the bus to follow the monks to Melrose in the *Borders*. The monastery we will visit there was built in the twelfth century, but we will also see the site of the

seventh century establishment of the Celtic monks. Continue to Durham. After arrival, we have a thorough tour of Durham Cathedral. It is a magnificent building with a fascinating history. One of the more interesting shifts between Anglo-



Saxon/Celtic and Latin/Roman monasticism took place here. Check in for the next two nights. In the evening, we meet at the cathedral for Evensong. BD

Day 7: Sunday, June 1, 2025: Lindisfarne

Now it is on to the other "holy island," Lindisfarne. Having been summoned by King Oswald of Northumbria, St. Aidan established a monastery and the seat of his diocese here in 635 AD. We will spend the day here, wandering the site and listening to talks by local experts. Then before the tide rolls in we will leave the island; a short drive will bring us back to Durham. BD



Day 8: Monday, June 2, 2025: Newcastle

In the morning we travel to Newcastle. We will stop at Bede's World. The site is a museum boasting artifacts from north-east of England and a full-sized eighth century Anglo-Saxon village. In the afternoon we board our overnight ferry to Amsterdam. BD

Day 9: Tuesday, June 3, 2025: The Netherlands and Germany

In the morning we arrive in Amsterdam and board our bus to follow our way to Lutherland. In the afternoon we arrive in Eisenach where we check in at our hotel for dinner and overnight. BD

Day 10: Wednesday, June 4, 2025: Eisenach

Join a city tour of Eisenach and take the beautiful trip up the mountain to the Wartburg Castle. After his excommunication, Martin Luther was kidnapped by his prince and hid here for almost a year under the alias of "Junker Jorg." See the room where Luther lived and made his translation of the New Testament. Later visit the Bach House -

experience what a typical home looked like in the 18th century, see an interesting collection of antique instruments and hear a demonstration on a variety of these pieces. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. BD

Day 11: Thursday, June 5, 2025: Erfurt

Discover Erfurt this morning: Wealthy merchants founded Erfurt's university. When Luther studied



here, the university was a center of humanist thought where church dogma was brought into question. We will visit St. Mary's Cathedral, where Luther was ordained. The stained glass windows, bronze candelabra, and Gloriosa bell were all here during Luther's time. We will enjoy a walk through the Augustinerkloster, where Luther celebrated his first mass and lived as a monk for six years. Another historic son of Erfurt is the philosopher and theologian of the 13./14. Century, Meister Eckhart. We visit his working place Predigerkirche where he was the Prior of the Dominican Convent. Return to Eisenach. Free evening to discover the Thuringian cuisine on our own. No group dinner tonight. B



Day 12: Friday, June 6, 2025: Eisleben

This morning we drive to Eisleben. We have a guided tour of Eisleben: Luther's birth and death occurred here, his Bethlehem and Jerusalem. His home is typical of the Middle Ages. An exhibition interprets the spiritual environment of Luther's childhood. You can further understand the foundation of Luther's faith when you visit the Church of St. Peter and Paul, where Luther was baptized. The late medieval residence where Luther died is preserved nearby. Our tour includes a stop at St. Andrews, where Luther gave his last four sermons. After lunch on our own, we continue to Wittenberg. We check in at Colleg Wittenberg for the next four nights. Dinner and overnight. BD

Day 13: Saturday, June 7, 2025: Leipzig

In October 1989, the people of Leipzig first organized the demonstrations that brought hundreds of thousands

into the streets for the "Peaceful Revolution." We will visit their rendezvous point at the Gothic (12th century) St. Nicholas Church and have a guided city walking tour. Afterwards free time for lunch on our own. In the afternoon enjoy the Motette at the 14th-century St. Thomas Church, where Luther preached and where Bach served as cantor and choirmaster for 25 years. Meet with a local pastor who shares the story of how the Peaceful Revolution began. Tonight we will dine at the historic Auerbachs Keller, where, in a scene made famous by Goethe's *Faust*, Mephistopheles and Faust drank with the local students before flying away on a barrel. Return to Wittenberg. BD

Day 14: Sunday, June 8, 2025: Wittenberg

We join the City Church Congregation for Sunday Worship Service. A local guide will help us explore the city, where Martin Luther lived and taught for 36 years. The first part of the tour includes the City Church, where Luther preached thousands of times,

and the Castle Church, where he posted his "95 Theses," thus sparking the Reformation. Free evening; explore Wittenberg restaurants on your own. B

Day 15: Monday, June 9, 2025: Wittenberg

After breakfast meet for part two of our city tour. In 1883, the Prussian Crown Prince established the "Lutherhaus" as a museum, which archives more than 10,000 prints, 6,000 manuscripts, 2,000



coins and medals, and 14,000 illustrations. We explore the three-story museum, which displays only a fraction of its Reformation collection, the world's largest. The Reformer's living room, known as the "Lutherstube," is especially well preserved. Another museum is the Melanchthon House museum, which we will visit afterwards. Free evening tonight, no group dinner. B



Day 16: Tuesday, June 10, 2025: Berlin

We leave Wittenberg for Berlin. Our visit include the bomb-damaged tower of Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church, Brandenburg Gate, Reichstag and "Unter den Linden", the government district. At noon, stop at Berlin Cathedral for a short organ devotion. The afternoon is free to discover Germany's capital by yourself. After check in at our hotel, we gather again for our farewell dinner at a local restaurant. BD

Day 17: Wednesday, June 11, 2025: Good Bye

All too soon we have to say Good Bye to Europe and will be transferred to the airport for our homebound flights. B
